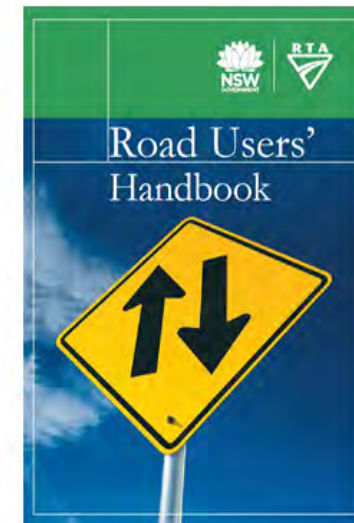

 - ~ Choice of 2 dual control driver training vehicles
- **Community based – culturally respectful**
 - ~ Consult with community, deliver in remote locations, Aboriginal trainers and mentors

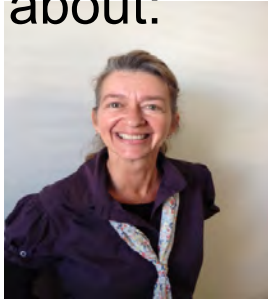
